he solar eclipse of August 21, 2017 was a total eclipse visible within a band across the entire contiguous United States, passing from the Pacific to the Atlantic coasts. Prior to this event, no solar eclipse had been visible across the entire contiguous United States since June 8, 1918; not since the February 1979 eclipse had a total eclipse been visible from anywhere in the mainland United States. This total solar eclipse marked the first such event in the smartphone and social media era in America. Information, personal communication, and photography were widely available as never before, capturing popular attention and enhancing the social experience.

Government launches nationwide campaign Gaj Yatra to protect elephants...

Cocktail geo-engineering an attempt to reverse global warming

Global warming, the ongoing increase in global temperatures is attributed to the rapidly increasing concentrations of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere. Scientists have been trying to look for alternative strategies to stop the rising temperatures in a more immediate timeframe. Planetary scale geo-engineering solutions have often been suggested. One of the ideas that has been explored for quite some time involves placing of artificial reflectors-giant mirrors or very small reflecting particles in outer space that can reflect back some part of solar radiation incident on earth's surface. By blocking a part of sun rays, temperatures on the earth can be brought down. Injection of sulphate aerosols, very fine solid particles, into the stratosphere is one of the most widely discussed ideas to achieve this objective. Sulphate aerosol particles are very good reflectors of sunlight, and it has been shown, through various climate models, that even if 1% of current incident solar radiation is reflected back in space, a very significant amount of temperature rise on earth can be offset.

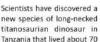

It is the biggest tax reform since Independence and is expected to gradually re-shape India's business landscape, making the world's fastest-growing major economy an easier place to do business.

ustice Dipak Misra took the oath of office as the 45th Chief Justice of India on 27th August. He has a tenure of just under 14 months, till October 2, 2018. President Ram Nath Kovind administered the oath to Justice Misra at a brief ceremony held in the Darbar Hall of the Rashtrapati

The Chief Justice of India (CJI) is the head of the judiciary of India and the Supreme Court of India. The CJI also heads their administrative functions.

As head of the supreme court, the Chief Justice allocates all work to the other judges who are bound to refer the matter back to him or her (for re-allocation) in any case where they require it to be looked into by a larger bench of more judges.

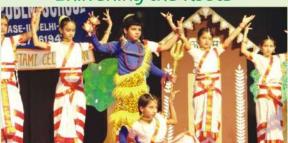

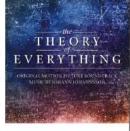

I still remember the first day of my wards in the school when both my tiny tots were holding my hands fightly and were not ready to go and now both are ready to say goodbye to school within few months. The journey went smoothly with few ups and down, as child grows up; it may appear as a simple matter of blowing out a different number of candles each year. However, there are multiple psychological factors involved. The factors include parents role in the child's life, peer pressure, the culture in which the child is raised. These factors work together to shape a child's social development. As my both children were quite introvert and submissive, it worried me in beginning but slowly and gradually they flourished in such a way that one advanced in the field of sports since class VI and my daughter who was once a shy kid, gained confidence in oration and has now titled herself to be the cultural secretary of the school. It feels good to see a positive confidence growing in your kids. One thing I would like to tell you all is whether we as a parent like it or not, kids change. Their behavior, their attitudes, their likes and dislikes these shifts can be seen throughout the childhood. But the biggest change and the hardest for most of us to deal with are the ones that occur when kids enter pre-adolescent and adolescent stage. As the old saying goes, "the only thing that is constant in life is change," and children are no exception from this rule. Sometimes the change from childhood to the pre-teen and teen years can appear to be quite drastic. Kids can suddenly lose interest in the things they used to play with, and it can take parents by surprise. It may seem like one day your child is playing with dolls or trucks, and the next day the one who aren't really interested in clothes suddenly started caring about how they look. I also observed changes in my children, which at first surprised me a lot and put me in a tension but then I felt it is also necessary for development. As a parent I also grow with them each day. Though as a working mother it was little difficult for me to manage time for my children but when I look at them now, my 'stars' are quite independent in certain things which somehow makes me feel happy.

मुझे गर्व है......मैं हिन्दी हूँ



बच्चों, मैं हिन्दी हूँ। तुम्हारी मातृनाषा। तुम्हारी राष्ट्रभाषा। और मुझे गर्व है कि मेरी पहचान हिन्दुस्तान से है, इसकी माटी से है, इसके कण-कण से हैं। क्या तुमने कभी सोचा....... कि भारत में अनेक बोलियों व भाषाओं के होते हुए भी राजभाषा का दर्जा "कंवल मुझे ही क्यों प्राप्त हुआ ?" जानते हो हिन्दी दिवस कंवल 14 सितम्बर को ही क्यों मनाया जाता है? आखिर मुझे राष्ट्रभाषा बनाया किसने? — "मुझे राष्ट्रभाषा बनाया उन सभी हिन्दी प्रेमियों ने जो इस विश्व में मुझे सम्मान दिलाना चाहते थे। इनमें सबसे प्रथम नाम आता है भारत के राष्ट्रपिता महात्मा गाँधी का, क्योंकि उन्होंने मुझे जनमानस की भाषा कहा और सन् 1918 के हिन्दी साहित्य सम्मेलन में मुझे राष्ट्रभाषा बनाने के लिए पहल की थी। इसलिए 14 सितंबर,1949 को संविधान सभा ने निर्णय लिया कि भारतीय संविधान की धारा 343 में हिन्दी ही

भारत की राजभाषा होगी। यह निर्णय 14 सितंबर को लिया गया था, इसलिए इस दिन को हिन्दी दिवस के रूप में घोषित किया गया। हिन्दी को हर क्षेत्र में प्रसारित करने के लिए राष्ट्रभाषा प्रचार समिति के अनुरोध पर वर्ष 1953 से हिन्दी दिवस पूरे विश्व में प्रतिवर्श मनाया जाता है। मैं खुश होती हूँ वयोंकि आज भी भारतवर्ष के लोकगीतों की सुरीली तान में — मैं गूंजती हूँ। भारत के गाँवों की अमराइयों में — मेरी महक उठती हैं। आज भी मैं कल—कल करती मदमस्त नदिया की धारा की भाँति हर भारतीय के हृदय में हिलोरे लेकर प्रवाहित होती हूँ।

NUTRITION and DIETETICS

The Profession: Nutritionists and Dieticians are professionals equipped with the knowledge of the chemistry and nutritional value of foods and their preparation. They are experts who develop new uses of food, advise patients in a clinic regarding their diet, serve as consultants to Public Health teams, supervise the serving of food in Industrial Cafeterias or Hospitals, assist individuals or groups in Dietary Education, and teach in Nursing Schools, Colleges and Universities.

Areas of Specialization

- Institutional Food Administration
- Public Health Nutrition
- Career Structure

- Therapeutic Nutrition
- Community Nutrition
- Clinical Dietetics
- Food Technology

Training: As the practice of dietetics requires considerable technical knowledge and experience, formal training is essential for a successful career.

Eligibility: High school students interested becoming a dietician or nutritionist should take up biology, chemistry, and if possible home science. After this, a graduation in food and nutrition or home science can be undertaken followed by a PG course in dietetics food and nutrition. A Post graduate diploma in food and nutrition is also one of the options available.

Duration: The Post Graduate Diploma course in Dietetics and Nutrition is spread over one academic year, with a compulsory 3 month internship in a Hospital under a Qualified Dietician.

Personal Attributes Required: Excellent communication skills, ability to get on with people, ability to co-ordinate with other consultants, good health, emotional stability and a scientific bent of mind, the ability to empathize with and understand others' problems.

Job Prospects: There are a variety of employment opportunities that are open to qualified nutritionists and dieticians. The majority find posts in Hospitals, schools, colleges and industrial or institutional canteens. There are also various opportunities to work for government departments or as programme consultants to NGO's like UNICEF, WHO and NPCCED.

Future prospects: Nutritionists and dieticians have and will continue to be an integral component of health care services as well as public health nutrition programs.

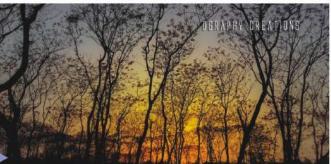

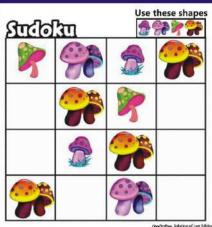




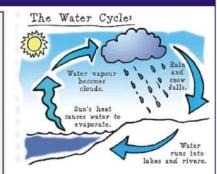

The Counselor's Corner: CHAOS TO COHERENCE

"It's not the load that breaks you down, it's the way you carry it"

STRESS — Stress heavily strains our "Pro-social Emotion" (Compassion and Empathy). Whether it be Teachers, Students or Parents, we want to keep giving until we reach 'Compassion Exhaustion', and when that happens, we stop caring. As it has become a part of our routine, rather than doing something about it, we've accepted it. Acceptance is good but giving up isn't. Of course, the bills won't stop coming, exams would continue to be our frequent visitors, there will never be more hours in the day and our work and family responsibilities would always demand more from us. But we have a lot more control than we think we do. In fact, the simple realization that we have control over our lives is the foundation of managing stress. It narrows our ability to function effectively, think clearly and enjoy life. It is important for everyone to realize that Nobody is going to live for you.



To move from Chaos to Coherence, we need to avoid the toxic influences of our environment into our lives. It is important to recognize that stress is a perception and you have control over your perceptions. Let's invest into happiness; you'll get higher returns when you do that. And when stress really knocks on your door, this is how you deal with it:

- Deal with stress like it's a shadow, it always follows you around but you're always ahead.
- Identity is our first priority, so look for the sources of stress in your life.
- When we're sitting at home and earning nothing but calories, we feel guilty....don't we? So, why do we have to gain weight to learn that it is important to replace unhealthy Coping Strategies with healthy ones, start rehearsing already.
- A better deal always costs you more, right? Not always in terms of money though. Embrace change. Practice the 4 A's of Stress Management and apply it like an anti-biotic.

The four A's - Avoid, Alter, Adapt & Accept

Avoid unnecessary stress — It's not healthy to avoid a stressful situation that needs to be addressed, but you may be surprised by the number of stressors in your life that you can eliminate

Alter the situation — If you can't avoid a stressful situation, try to alter it. Often, this involves changing the way you communicate and operate in your daily life.

Adapt to the stressor — If you can't change the stressor, change yourself. You can adapt to stressful situations and regain your sense of control by changing your expectations and attitude

Accept the things you can't change — Some sources of stress are unavoidable. You can't prevent or change stressors such as the death of a loved one, a serious illness, or a national recession. In such cases, the best way to cope with stress is to accept things as they are. Acceptance may be difficult, but in the long run, it's easier than railing against a situation you can't change.

- Now you're doing the right things. Get moving.
- This happens to everybody, share and Connect with others.
- This is easy. Make time for fun and relaxation.
- Just because time's running, doesn't mean you've to chase it. Manage your time better.
- Maintain balance with a healthy lifestyle.
- It's not just sufficient but necessary to keep tapping into your Inner Strengths.
- Self-reflection brings out the best in you every day.
- Cognitive restructuring or turning the negativity around can help you cope better.
- Meditation helps you relax and process the important things in life.
- Massage and Exercise helps you relieve stress, and if followed regularly, stress would hardly be your
